What is Cryptocurrency?

Cryptocurrency is any form of currency that exists digitally or virtually and uses cryptography to secure transactions. Cryptocurrencies don't have a central issuing or regulating authority, instead using a decentralized system to record transactions and issue new units. Cryptocurrency is a digital payment system that doesn't rely on banks to verify transactions. It's a peer-to-peer system that can enable anyone anywhere to send and receive payments. Instead of being physical money carried around and exchanged in the real world, cryptocurrency payments exist purely as digital entries to an online database describing specific transactions. Cryptocurrency is stored in digital wallets. Cryptocurrency received its name because it uses encryption to verify transactions. The aim of encryption is to provide security and safety. The first cryptocurrency was Bitcoin, which was founded in 2009 and remains the best known today.

Job Interview

Mock interviews will help you feel more comfortable in the actual setting. To be on the safe side, arrive a few minutes early.



7 Tips to Win the Job Interview

- Maintain eye contact when being asked questions or when giving answers. Show the interviewer that you're attentive and interested. Be positive, breathe naturally and try to relax.
- Don't use negative body language by crossing your arms, clenching your fists or curling your hair. Good posture shows confidence.
- Dress for success. Do not wear tightfitting clothes or heavy makeup. Keep it simple. Conservative hairstyles are recommended.
- Don't interrupt when the interviewer is talking. Use good manners and say thank you after the interview. A smile goes a long way when meeting the interviewer or anyone else at the company.
- Be prepared to share specific examples of how you've used your skills. You are selling yourself and want to get the job. It's important for you to convince the interviewer you're the person to hire. Employers like people who know who they are, both their strengths and weaknesses.
- Be honest even if it means admitting you don't know something.
 Show them you have great ethics right from the start.
- Don't speak negatively of yourself or a former employer. For example, don't say you left your last job because you didn't get along with your last supervisor.



Highest Quality of Life in 2021

Standard of living refers to the level of wealth, comfort, necessities, and material goods available to a particular geographic area. It is often used interchangeably with quality of life, which is generally understood to include the same measures of prosperity as standard of living, but also incorporate physical and mental health and wellness. One of the most comprehensive equations is Numbeo's Quality of Life Index, which measures eight indices: purchasing power, safety, health care, cost of living, property price to income ratio, traffic commute time, pollution, and climate.

Based on these indices, the top of the list breaks down as follows:

- 1. Switzerland 188.36
- 2. Denmark 186.25
- 3. Netherlands 180.27
- 4. Finland 178.95
- 5. Australia 178.41
- 6. Iceland 177.64
- 7. Austria 176.36
- 8. Germany 175.24
- 9. New Zealand 173.60
- 10. Luxembourg 171.81
